Ms. Libby Messick called the meeting to order at 10:03 a.m.

Upon reviewing the minutes of the April 10, 2024, meeting, a motion to approve the minutes was made by Mr. Mark Stephens and was seconded by Mr. Fred Denney.

OLD BUSINESS:

There were no old business items to discuss.

NEW BUSINESS:

Ms. Messick called for a review of the FY 24-27 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. She gave the members handouts of the list of MPO projects. Ms. Messick explained that two administrative modifications created changes to the TIP spreadsheet and one administrative modification did not create changes to the TIP spreadsheet.

Ms. Messick then called for a discussion of Resolution No. 863. Ms. Messick explained this resolution was to increase the construction apportionment for project #48 – Widening and Improvements on Friendship Rd from Cheaha Drive to Circle Dr in the City of Oxford. This Resolution has been tabled since March. No new updates were to be had.

Ms. Messick then called for a discussion of Resolution No. 865. Ms. Messick explained this resolution was to amend the FY 24 UPWP to add FY 23 rollover funds, create 2 new tasks, and allocate the remainder of the funds to 2 current tasks. A motion was made by Mr. Toby Bennington, to pass **Resolution No. 865**, which Mr. Mark Stephens seconded. Motion carried.

Ms. Messick then called for a discussion of Resolution No. 866. Ms. Messick explained this resolution was to amend the design scope to project #64: pedestrian crossing at McClellan Blvd to add an additional \sim 1350' of sidewalk from the proposed crosswalk at the 431 southbound ramps down to the city property entrance at Regar Circle in order to connect with the crosswalk to the Museum and Garden trails. A

motion was made by Mr. Fred Denney, to pass **Resolution No. 864**, which Mr. Toby Bennington seconded. Motion carried.

Ms. Messick next called for a discussion of the Status Report of Pre-Construction projects. Mr. Brady Whatley reported project 41 was waiting on plan review; project 48 nneded RoW map to be sent to region; project 50 needs the design waiver to be signed; and all other projects were up to date.

Ms. Messick next called for a discussion of the Status Report of ALDOT projects. Mr. Shane Brown had sent a report prior to the meeting that reported the reconfiguration of the intersection at US 78 and Barry St has begun phase II traffic shift and drainage structure work north of US 78 has begun; SR-21 resurfacing in Oxford has the wearing surface placed along US 78 and has began placing wearing surface along SR 21; resurfacing on SR-21 from north of Summerall Gate to George Douthit has their precon meeting scheduled for May 15th.

Next, Ms. Messick continued by calling for a discussion of Safety Observations. She explained that there was a handout in the agenda packet with the list of concerns from the CAC that had been discussed at previous meetings for review. The newest additions to the list included potholes on MLK and Mainstreet in Oxford were reported. Ms. Messick stated one was actually in Hobson City and was a manhole collar that had been busted and has left a dip in the road. She would investigate to find exact location of the other pothole before continuing discussion.

Next, Ms. Messick called for the Report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. She reported the TAB meeting would be the following week and she would have April's information at the MPO meeting.

The next TAC meeting will be Wednesday, June 12, at 10:00 a.m.

There being no other business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 10:20 a.m.

Amending the Fiscal Year 2024 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) to add Task 6.7 City of Anniston Bicycle-Pedestrian Design/Installation Manual Update

WHEREAS, the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is the organization designated by the Governor of the State of Alabama as being responsible, together with the State of Alabama, for implementing the applicable provisions of 23 USC 134 and 135 (amended Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, November 2021); 42 USC 2000d-1, 7401; 23 CFR 450 and 500; 40 CFR 51 and 93; and,

WHEREAS, the US Department of Transportation (USDOT) requires all urbanized areas, as established by the US Bureau of the Census, to do area-wide transportation planning, and the designated planning organization to submit a Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) as a condition for meeting the provisions of Title 23 USC 134; and,

WHEREAS, consistent with the declaration of these provisions, the East Alabama Regional Planning and Development Commission, as staff to the MPO, in cooperation with the Local Transportation Bureau, Alabama Department of Transportation, has prepared a Unified Planning Work Program for Fiscal Year 2020; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to its duties, functions, and responsibilities, the Calhoun Area MPO proposes to allocate the \$40,000 administration funds from Task 6.1, which is a holdover task for future special projects and plans, to create Task 6.7 City of Anniston Bicycle-Pedestrian Design/Installation Manual update. The City of Anniston will be responsible for the 20% match (\$8,000).

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Calhoun Area MPO, that the Fiscal Year 2024 UPWP be amended as indicated above.
