Vice Chairman Tim Huddleston called the meeting to order at 10:03 a.m.
Eric Wright introduced Elizabeth Wright, EARPDC Regional Transportation Planner as the new MPO staff.

OLD BUSINESS:

The minutes of the CAC meetings from November 20, 2024, were approved on a motion by Mr. Lem Burell, seconded by Mr. Johnnie Phillips. The motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Vice Chairman Huddleston called Eric Wright to review the FY 24-27 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. Mr. Wright explained that neither the TIP nor the Administrative Modifications were modified.

Mr. Huddleston reviewed the CAC's role in resolutions and reminded everyone that the CAC does not approve resolutions but makes recommendations to either adopt, reject, or review them.

Mr. Huddleston then called for a discussion of Resolution No. 863. Mr. Wright explained that this resolution has been discussed but is still tabled. This resolution pertains to expanding the budget for project 100070250, which involves widening and improving Friendship Road from Cheaha Drive to Circle Drive in the City of Oxford. No motion to pass or reject was made, as it is still tabled while we finalize budgeting.

Next, Mr. Huddleston called for a discussion of Resolution No. 870. Mr. Wright explained that this resolution was to adopt and support the statewide performance measurement targets for safety, bridge/pavement, and system performance. These targets are set by the ALDOT, and MPOs have the option to develop their own more stringent targets, but generally, the statewide requirements are adopted in each region. Bill Williams made a motion to pass Resolution #870, which Theo Smart seconded. The motion carried.

Next, Mr. Huddleston called for a discussion of Resolution No. 871. Mr. Wright explained that this resolution removed Carbon Reduction Fund PE project 100070238 and CN project 100070239 pertaining to the Baltzell Gate Connector Multi-Use Path. The City of Anniston added this project to the TIP in 2023, but they have now requested it be removed. Johnnie Phillips made a motion to pass Resolution #871, which Theo Smart seconded. The motion carried.

Next, Mr. Huddleston called for a discussion of Resolution No. 872. Mr. Wright explained that this resolution removed Carbon Reduction Fund PE project 100070241 and CN project 100070242 pertaining to the Coldwater Mountain to Mulberry Street Multi-Use Path. The City of Anniston also added this project to the TIP but has now requested it be removed. Anne Key made a motion to pass Resolution #872, which Lem Burell seconded. The motion carried.

Next, Mr. Huddleston called for a discussion of Resolution No. 873. Mr. Wright explained that this was the Certification of the FY25 ADA Paratransit Plan. He gave a short explanation distinguishing the difference between transit and paratransit and how this plan maintains compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Tony Ball made a motion to pass Resolution #873, which Lem Burell seconded. The motion carried.

Next, Mr. Huddleston called on Eric Wright for a report on ALDOT Pre-Construction Projects. Mr. Wright reported that we did not get any updates from the ALDOT.

Next, Mr. Huddleston called on Eric Wright for a report on ALDOT construction projects. Mr. Wright reported that we did not get any updates from the ALDOT.

Next, Mr. Huddleston called for a review of new safety observations. Mr. Wright reviewed the additions made from the previous meeting and explained that the TAC is reviewing them. No major updates. In regards to the stacking issue on Quintard Avenue, it has been presented to both the TAC and ALDOT and while they understand the concerns, the retiming process needs to be carried out before they can do anything further.

Mr. Theo Smart raised a potential safety observations on the 2200 block of West McDaniel Avenue where two different speed bumps are present. One is made of rubber and the other is asphalt. When a vehicle drives over the asphalt speedbump, vehicles make contact with the asphalt. Mr. Wright questioned if this observation truly met the qualifications of a safety observation. Mr. Wright agreed to pass the information along to the City of Anniston but not add an official safety observation to the list.

Mr. Richard Lindblom offered a safety observation for the I20 West exit to the 431 Bypass. He mentioned the heavy traffic during rush hours and the need for additional lighting and possible improvements made to the entry lane from I20 to the 431 bypass. Mr. Huddleston agreed that the

area is laid out in a somewhat confusing manner and there could be room for some improvement. There was discussion on ownership of the exit ramp and Mr. Wright agreed to research the issue and report back.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Mr. Huddleston called for a review of CAC vacancies and reminded everyone about the membership subcommittee's role in appointing new members. A request was made to resume attendance tracking to ensure members are active and engaged. Mr. Huddleston requests the subcommittee review its members in our next meeting to assess the need to fill spots and resume working toward filling the CAC vacancies.

Mr. Huddleston called for a review of the transit ridership reports. Mr. Eric Wright reviewed the tables and gave a short overview of trends. Numbers are up and approaching pre-Covid numbers. Mr. Wright gave an update on questions about shelters to explain that financial constraints and right-of-way restrictions often limit the ability to build shelters at every stop. If specific locations have increased need or property owners are willing to partner with a shelter being built, he will pass the information to the transit team.

Mr. Huddleston gave a short review of the maps displaying the ALDOT construction projects on AL-21 from Lenlock area to George Douthit in Jacksonville. Mr. Wright reminded that this is an ALDOT project and not an MPO project.

The next CAC meeting was scheduled for Wednesday, February 26, at 10:00 a.m.

Mr. Huddleston called for a motion to adjourn. Mr. Theo Smart made the motion, which was seconded by Mr. Tony Ball. The meeting was adjourned at 10:58 a.m.
